
Organisation Profile

In 2019, HakiElimu emerged the overall winner against 389 CSO's across 46 countries. We also won in the categories Strategic Ability and Adaptability and Leadership and Governance.

Strategic Focus (2022 – 2026)

1. Equity and Quality Learning for all Children

We advocate for Government to develop and implement evidence-based policies that promote accessibility, equity and inclusive quality education in a friendly an protective environment

Evidence Generation

HakiElimu generates evidence of the learning and teaching environment in Tanzania through research, policy and budget analysis, and by piloting innovative initiatives. Some key recent studies:

- Magnitude of Violence Against Children in School and barriers to prevention.
- Factors that hinder and facilitate best performance in national examinations.
- Girls Basic Education in Tanzania: a focus on factors that affect Girls' Retention and Transition Rates.

- An Assessment of the Learning and Teaching Environment for Pre-Primary education in Tanzania.
- An Examination of Learning and Participation of Visually Impaired Students in Inclusive Schools.
- Impacts of implementing the fee free education policy.
- Review of Education and Training Policy: The Education We Want.
- Policy and Sexual & Reproductive Health & Rights Education in Primary and Secondary Education in Tanzania.

Government Engagement

We use evidence to develop policy and budget recommendations for government. We engage government through the established local education dialogue structures such as Education Sector Development Committee (ESDC) and Technical Working Groups (TWG) and Annual Joint Education Sector Review (AJESR) to advance core HakiElimu agenda in equity and quality of learning.

Creating National Awareness

HakiElimu produces evidence-based media campaigns targeting both citizens and policy makers with messages and calls to action. We utilize a number of platforms including publications, television, national and local radio, and social media.

Testing What Works

HakiElimu initiates and pilots innovative interventions to stimulate supportive and effective classroom learning strategies and teachers' professional development, specifically in learner-centred

teaching and inclusive education to enable practicing teachers to become reflective practitioners to search solutions to the actual learning problems. HakiElimu innovations in selected schools provide proof that "another world is possible".

2. Citizens participation and engagement

We promote citizen participation in the provision and monitoring of equitable, inclusive and quality education

Empowering Citizens

Lasting change must be driven by citizens at community and national level. Working through our grassroots network of more than 46,000 *Friends of Education* (Community based organisations and individuals who volunteer their time and skills to transform education) we empower and enhance the voice and participation of all citizens (including those who are marginalised because of their gender, level of ability or income), so they can assume ownership of their development and to advance democracy.

We achieve this by; -

Translating complex concepts and policies into easy to understand information (e.g. Comic books)

Capacity building of *Friends of Education,* providing them with the knowledge and tools

Creating platforms for *Friends of Education* to participate in dialogue and decision-making structures at local and national level

Citizens Transforming Education

Friends of Education monitor school performance to identify local education challenges and raise awareness of these challenges through Theatre for Development, local radio talk shows and imaginative public dialogues. The *Friends of Education* use these platforms to promote creative local solutions to effect social change that will improve education.

3. Government transparency, responsiveness and accountability.

We promote and advocate for transparency and accountability in the provision of quality education



Our approach to increasing government and stakeholders' responsiveness and accountability, involves working with oversight bodies and other civil society organisations to improve the planning processes and influence the approval and expenditure of public resources / budgets for education.

Transparency and Accountability in Education Budgeting

We engage MPs before, during and after the budgeting process to influence education budget allocation, approval and disbursement. We conduct pre and post budget surveys and share the findings with MPs to inform their discussions during budget sessions.

Enhanced District and School Leadership

Once budgets are approved we focus on oversight bodies, such as Local Government Authorities (LGA's), head teachers and school committees, building their capacity to understand policies and budgets and their roles in implementing them.

Communities holding schools and leaders accountable

HakiElimu works through citizens/*Friends of Education* who implement Social Accountability Monitoring (SAM) and Public Expenditure Tracking Surveys (PETS) to monitor accountability levels and specifically the utilisation of resources allocated by the government against funding spent on planned education activities to combat resource misuse.

Partnership and Collaboration

HakiElimu strengthens partnership and collaboration with like-minded CSOs to advocate for access to information, policy change and amendment of repressive laws. We work with national and international CSOs to promote and embrace national, regional and international joint learning initiatives amongst CSOs for capacity strengthening and stronger policy influencing. HakiElimu is leveraging its expertise to support shared learning and capacity building at the national and regional level. We are leading a number of learning networks such as Regional Education Learning Initiative (RELI) and Coalition of Good Schools (CoGS). We are also the current Chair of the Policy Forum Budget Working Group.
